2014 Annual Report

Whenever possible, the Fairfield County Engineer's office applies for grant money to assist in repairing the roads and bridges in our County. 2014 was no exception! Our office constructed three major projects this year with each one utilizing grant money. We improved two intersections and replaced one bridge for a total construction cost of \$1,191,426. Of this, \$919,374 of this construction was paid for with grant money. In addition to these three projects, we received a federal aid grant which replaced/improved guardrail along eight different bridges. Construction costs for this guardrail totaled \$159,486, with a federal grant covering 100% of these costs.

Once again this year, the Fairfield County Engineer's Office teamed up with a Board of Township Trustees in order to improve our roadways for the traveling public. The Board of Berne Township Trustees was able to obtain funding from the Ohio Public Works Commission to conduct an intersection improvement and relocation project for Sugar Grove Road/Mirgon Road. This allowed the Board of Berne Township Trustees and our office to split the local share money for the construction of this project.

Obtaining these extra funds when available gives us the ability to apply funds to more projects throughout the year. It is our mission to continue applying for grant money as it becomes available so that we can keep our roadways safe for the traveling public.

2014 Road & Bridge Projects



The Violet 43 (VIO-43) Bridge (pictured right) is located on Taylor Road. This project consisted of replacing an existing single span bridge with a four-sided box culvert. This bridge replacement project was designed by EMH&T. Rock River Construction, Ltd. from Lancaster, Ohio replaced this bridge for a construction cost of \$344,516.22. An OPWC grant helped to fund this project.



The Fairfield County Engineer's Office and the Board of Berne Township Trustees teamed-up to relocate the intersection of **Sugar Grove Road (CR65) and Mirgon Road (TR327)** (pictured left). The geometrics of this intersection dated back more than 100 years. The relocation of this intersection not only enhanced the sight distance at this intersection and provided full depth pavement replacement, but also widened shoulders and removed the steep grade on Mirgon Road. This intersection relocation was designed by the Fairfield County Engineer's Office and was constructed by Shelly and Sands, Inc. from Columbus, Ohio for a total construction cost of \$494,153.85. An OPWC grant helped to fund this project.



Julian Road (CR71) at the intersection of Strickler Road was improved in 2014 (*picture left*). Construction of this project consisted of full depth pavement and resurfacing, realigning Strickler Road, and improving sight distance at the intersection of Julian Road and Strickler Road. Lockwood, Lanier, Mathias, & Noland, Inc. designed this project. Construction was completed by The Shelly Company, from Thornville, Ohio, for a construction cost of \$352,755.92. A federal aid grant helped to fund this project.



ICE AND SNOW CONTROL

Approximately \$355,470.60 was spent on salt, grits, and brine in 2014. Road crews purchased approximately 5108.48 tons of grits and 6012.26 tons of salt to keep the county road system open. Such treatment is applied at intersections, hills and curves as first priority. Depending on weather conditions and effectiveness, brine is also used on our arterial routes and some collector routes.

2014 RESURFACING

The Shelly Company of Thornville, Ohio received the 2014 Resurfacing Contracts for a total construction cost of \$995,107.06 Resurfacing took place on sections of the following roadways: Hill Road, Wheeling Road, Hamburg Road, Lithopolis Road, Collins Road, and Rock Mill Road.

The Fairfield County Engineer's Office also teamed up with Franklin County in a cooperative effort to resurface Pickerington Road between Stemen Road & SR 204.

CULVERT PROJECTS

County forces replaced 31 culverts in 2014 for a total cost of \$271,268.22

2014 PAVEMENT MARKING PROGRAM

A&A Safety of Amelia, Ohio was awarded our 2014 Pavement Markings Project on Various Routes. 67.10 miles of roadway was striped at a construction cost of \$40,260.00.

In addition to the above mentioned project, seven counties teamed up for a cooperative pavement marking project. Fairfield County was able to stripe an additional 59.4 miles of roadway.

DAMAGED PROPERTY

Every year the County must repair or replace guardrail and signs damaged due to auto accidents. In 2014, the County was reimbursed approximately \$6,895 for county property damaged during accidents.
